

1. WHEREAS, the gray wolf in Wisconsin is currently listed as an
2. endangered species by the Federal Government; and

4. WHEREAS, the status of listed as "endangered" negates the ability of
5. the State of Wisconsin to manage the wolf population and attempt to
6. control depredation of livestock and pets by problem wolves; and
- 7.
8. WHEREAS, the target population, set by the Federal Government, for
9. delisting the wolf in Wisconsin and Michigan, must be greater
10. than 100 animals sustained for a period of five years; and
- 11.
12. WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR)
13. places the Wisconsin 2010 late winter population estimate at 720, said
14. population having been in excess of 350 since 2003, with wolves
15. occupying virtually all suitable habitat in Wisconsin; and
- 16.
17. WHEREAS, the wolf population in Wisconsin has exceeded the above
18. specified target population for delisting; and
- 19.
20. WHEREAS, there is no reason to believe the wolf remains endangered
21. or threatened in Wisconsin, and
- 22.
23. WHEREAS, the WDNR has submitted a petition to the U.S.
24. Department of Interior (USDOJ) and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife
25. Service (USFWS) to delist the gray wolf in Wisconsin.

27. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Clark County Board of
28. Supervisors in session this 22nd day of July 2010 requests that the
29. USDOJ and the USFWS move ahead to delist the gray wolf in
30. Wisconsin, as petitioned by the WDNR, transferring management of
31. the wolf population in Wisconsin to the State of Wisconsin.

33. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clark County Board of
34. Supervisors requests that the State of Wisconsin use all its legal
35. resources to pursue the delisting of the gray wolf in Wisconsin from
36. the Federal Endangered and Threatened Species Lists and transfer wolf
37. management in the State of Wisconsin to the State of Wisconsin.

47. needed population controls to bring the wolf population to goal levels
48. when formulating the next Wisconsin Wolf Management Plan.
