TO THE HONORABLE, THE OUTAGAMIE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:

MAJORITY

1 Under current state law, Wisconsin Retirement System participants who are not a
2 protective occupation participant may retire as early as age 55 and qualify for an
3 immediate annuity from the WRS. There is pending legislation that would increase the
4 minimum retirement age to 59.5 years old for participants who are under the age of 40
5 on the effective date of the bill.

6
7 Additionally, under current law, a WRS participant who has applied to receive a
8 retirement annuity must wait at least 75 days between ending employment before
9 returning to a WRS participating employer. Pending legislation would reduce the
10 waiting period for retirees to return to a WRS participating employer to 45 days.

11
12 Lastly, under current law, a retiree (who retired after July 2013) returning to the
13 workforce with a WRS participating employer may not work more than 1200 hours in a
14 year in order to maintain his/her annuity payments. Pending legislation would allow for
15 a retiree to work in a full time status for up to three years (36 months) without
16 suspending his/her WRS annuity.

17
18 NOW THEREFORE, the undersigned members of the Legislative/Audit and Human Resources
19 Committee recommend adoption of the following resolution.

20 BE IT RESOLVED, that the Outagamie County Board of Supervisors opposes pending
21 legislation that would increase the minimum retirement age from 55 years old to 59.5 years old for
22 participants who are under the age of 40 on the effective date of the bill so as not to discourage attracting
23 qualified talent to the public sector, and

24 BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Outagamie County Board of Supervisors does support
25 pending legislation that would reduce the waiting period for Wisconsin Retirement Systems retirees to
26 return to a Wisconsin Retirement System participating employer from 75 days to 45 days in order for
27 vacant public sector positions across the state to be quickly filled by qualified people, which in turn,
28 may help retain skilled public employees in the State of Wisconsin, and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Outagamie County Board of Supervisors does support
2 pending legislation that would allow a Wisconsin Retirement System retiree to work for a Wisconsin
3 Retirement System participating employer in a full time status for up to three years (36 months) without
4 suspending his/her WRS annuity, and

5 BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Outagamie County Clerk be directed to forward a copy
6 of this resolution to the Outagamie County Lobbyist for distribution to the Outagamie County
7 Legislators and the Wisconsin Counties Association.

1 **AN ACT to amend** 40.22 (1), 40.22 (2m) (intro.), 40.22 (2r) (intro.), 40.22 (3)
2 (intro.), 40.23 (1) (a) (intro.), 40.23 (1) (am) 2., 40.23 (1) (bm), 40.24 (1) (f), 40.25

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill makes a number of changes to the Wisconsin Retirement System (WRS). Currently, under the WRS, participants who are not protective occupation participants may retire as early as age 55 and qualify for an immediate annuity from the WRS. This bill increases the minimum retirement age to the greater of age 59.5 or the age at which the Internal Revenue Service does not penalize a person for taking a distribution from a 401 (k) plan. This change in the minimum retirement age first applies to individuals who are under the age of 40 on the bill's effective date and who terminate WRS-covered employment on or after the bill's effective date.

This bill also allows an annuitant who is hired by a WRS employer as an employee or to provide employee services to elect to not suspend his or her annuity

for not more than a total of 36 months. The bill also requires the Department of Employee Trust Funds to submit an annual report to the governor and the legislature that provides information about annuitants who are hired to positions and who elect to not suspend their annuities. Under current law, if a WRS annuitant, or a disability annuitant who has attained his or her normal retirement date, is appointed to a position with a WRS-participating employer, or provides employee services to a WRS-participating employer in which he or she is expected to work at least two-thirds of what is considered full-time employment by DETF, the annuity must be suspended and no annuity payment is payable until after the participant again terminates covered employment.

Finally, under current law, a WRS participant who has applied to receive a retirement annuity must wait at least 75 days between terminating covered employment with a WRS employer and returning to covered employment again as a participating employee. This bill reduces that period to 45 days.

Because this bill relates to public employee retirement or pensions, it may be referred to the Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems for a report to be printed as an appendix to the bill.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:

MAJORITY

1 Under current state law, Wisconsin Retirement System participants who are not a
2 protective occupation participant may retire as early as age 55 and qualify for an
3 immediate annuity from the WRS. There is pending legislation that would increase the
4 minimum retirement age to 59.5 years old for participants who are under the age of 40
5 on the effective date of the bill.

6
7 Additionally, under current law, a WRS participant who has applied to receive a
8 retirement annuity must wait at least 75 days between ending employment before
9 returning to a WRS participating employer. Pending legislation would reduce the
10 waiting period for retirees to return to a WRS participating employer to 45 days.

11
12 Lastly, under current law, a retiree (who retired after July 2013) returning to the
13 workforce ^{as a} WRS participating employer may not work more than 1200 hours in a
14 year in order to maintain his/her annuity payments. Pending legislation would allow for
15 a retiree to work in a full time status for up to three years (36 months) without
16 suspending his/her WRS annuity.

17
18 NOW THEREFORE, the undersigned members of the Legislative/Audit and Human Resources
19 Committee recommend adoption of the following resolution.

20 BE IT RESOLVED, that the Outagamie County Board of Supervisors opposes pending
21 legislation that would increase the minimum retirement age from 55 years old to 59.5 years old for
22 participants who are under the age of 40 on the effective date of the bill so as not to discourage attracting
23 qualified talent to the public sector, and

24 BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Outagamie County Board of Supervisors does support
25 pending legislation that would reduce the waiting period for Wisconsin Retirement Systems retirees to
26 return to a Wisconsin Retirement System participating employer from 75 days to 45 days in order for
27 vacant public sector positions across the state to be quickly filled by qualified people, which in turn,
28 may help retain skilled public employees in the State of Wisconsin, and
