WISCONSIN GI BILL

The Wisconsin GI Bill remits (forgives) full tuition and segregated fees for eligible veterans and their dependents for up to eight semesters or 128 credits, whichever is greater, at any University of Wisconsin System or Wisconsin Technical College System school. The Wisconsin GI Bill is a state program that is entirely separate from the Federal GI Bill.

WISCONSIN GI BILL HIGHLIGHTS

A qualifying veteran is a current Wisconsin resident who was either:

- A Wisconsin resident at time of entry into active military service.
 -OR-
- A Wisconsin resident for at least five consecutive years preceding the beginning of any semester or session for which he or she registers.

Eligibility for the WI GI Bill is determined by WDVA.

The educational institution administers the program.

Eligible family members of qualifying veterans (spouse/child) may use this benefit if the veteran has been awarded a service connected disability rating of at least 30% by the USDVA or died in the line of duty. Spouse/child must reside with the veteran.

Other important information

- Veteran must utilize Federal GI Bill benefits first
- No income limits
- No delimiting period
- No limits on level of study







VETERANS EDUCATION (VETED) GRANT

The Veterans Education (VetEd) grant program provides a reimbursement grant based on a credit-bank system that is based on length of active duty military service to eligible veterans who have not yet been awarded a bachelor's degree for the reimbursement of tuition and fees following successful course completion at an eligible UW, technical college, or approved private institution of higher learning.

To be eligible there is a income requirement.

VETERANS RETRAINING GRANT

Recently unemployed or underemployed veterans may receive up to \$3,000 per year, for a maximum of two years, if they have a financial need while being retrained for employment. The amount of the grant is determined by the applicant's financial need as calculated by the WDVA.

- Veteran must be enrolled in technical college or OJT program expected to lead to employment.
- For technical education, reimbursement goes to the veteran.
- For OJT, benefit is paid to employers to offset wages during training period.

VETERAN OWNED BUSINESS CERTIFICATION

The Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs recognizes the important role that veteran-owned and disabled veteran-owned businesses play in the Wisconsin economy. In order to help such businesses identify and promote themselves, the WDVA makes available a logo for certified veteran-owned businesses operating in Wisconsin.

May register with Wisconsin Department of Administration's esupplier system to be notified of state bids/contracts.

Authorizes use wisconsin veteran-owned business logo (including electronic versions of logo).

Business added to searchable database on WDVA website.

VETERANS EMPLOYMENT GRANT

The State of Wisconsin works to connect veterans with good, family supporting jobs. One way we do that is by supporting those businesses hiring honorably discharged veterans with a 50% or more service-connected disability

The Benefits of Hiring a Veteran

Veterans have qualities that every employer is looking for; leadership, the ability to work as a team leader and a team member, the ability to work under pressure and meet deadlines, the ability to give and follow directions, planning and organizational skills, commitment to working safely, and flexibility and adaptability.

Grant Program at a Glance

Employers can receive \$5,000 in funding over a 12 month period when they hire a qualifying veteran full-time and up to \$2,500 part-time.

VETERANS ENTREPRENUERSHIP GRANT

The Wisconsin Entrepreneurship Grant is available to registered 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(6) non-profit organizations that provide entrepreneurship training, or technical, business or other assistance to veteran entrepreneurs to improve employment outcomes. The Entrepreneurship Grant program includes a maximum total of up to \$400,000 annually.







VETERANS NONPROFIT GRANT

The Wisconsin Non-Profit Grant is available to registered 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations that provide financial assistance or other services to veterans and their dependents. The Non-Profit Grant program includes a maximum total of up to \$250,000 annually to nonprofit organizations and no more than \$25,000 to each grant recipient.
