Our goal is to count everyone once, only once, and in the right place!






## FEDERAL GOVERNANCE

- Article 1, Section 2 of the U.S. Constitution mandates a headcount every 10 years, of every person residing in the United States
- August 2, 1790 was the date of the very first census, led by Secretary of State Thomas Jefferson
- Title 13 of the US Code states that no private information acquired by the US Census Bureau will be shared with anyone, including other federal agencies






## APPORTIONMENT AND FUNDING



## NON-RESPONSE FOLLOW-UP

- Census takers will personally visit housing units to count or enumerate the households.
- If no one is at home, the census taker will leave a Notice of Visit to encourage self-response.
- In most situations, census takers will make at least six attempts to resolve a case.
- In-field operation begins in May 2020 and concludes in July 2020.






## **GROUP QUARTERS**

Group Quarters are places where people who are not related live or stay in a group living arrangement that is owned or managed by an entity or organization providing housing and/or services for the residents.

### **Examples:**

- College Residence Hall
- Group Home
- Prisons
- Nursing Homes
- Residential Treatment Centers





## Service Based Enumeration (SBE)

The Census Bureau will count people experiencing homelessness by locating them at places where they receive services and in outdoor locations.

### **Service Based locations include:**

- Shelters
- Soup Kitchens and Food Vans
- Emergency Shelters





# Targeted Non-Sheltered Outdoor Locations (TNSOL)

### Non-sheltered outdoor locations (TNSOL)

will be identified in advance. These are commonly known locations where individuals experiencing homelessness are most likely to congregate.

### Examples of TNSOL would be:

- Certain Street Intersections
- Public Transportation Stops
- Vacant Buildings





The census must also include people without a permanent place to live, so:

 If someone who does not have a permanent place to live is staying here on April 1, 2020, count that person.

The Census Bureau also conducts counts in institutions and other places, so:



## TYPE OF ENUMERATION AREA (TEA) VIEWER

- The U.S. Census Bureau uses TEA as the approach to conducting the 2020 Census for housing units in a given geographic area.
- Types of enumeration include: Self-response, update enumerate, remote Alaska, update leave and military
- Each enumeration type has a distinct color code





## 2020 Census Mail Contact Strategies Map

In the 2020 Census, about **95 percent** of housing units will receive their census invitations in the mail. This map shows the mail contact strategies for each community.

- Most housing units will *first* receive a letter asking you to go online to complete the census questionnaire (Highlighted in purple as "Internet First" on the map).
- Areas that are less likely to respond online will receive a paper questionnaire along with their first invitation, and this will include information about how to respond online or by phone (these Internet Choice areas are shown in green).
- Some areas will receive invitations in bilingual Spanish and English (darker shades), while most areas will receive invitations in English (lighter shades)



## RESPONSE OUTREACH AREA MAPPER (ROAM)

- Covers 2012 2016 (5 year estimate)
- Identifies hard-to-survey areas and provides a socioeconomic & demographic profile
- Darker / Deeper the color, the higher the Low Response Score (Light Beige to Green to Dark Blue)
