#### **BARRON COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 2019 - 2**

### Resolution Requesting Increased Funding and Oversight Reforms for Wisconsin's Child Protective Services System

## TO THE BARRON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

1	WHEREAS, the Wisconsin child welfare system is county-operated and state-
2	supervised, except Milwaukee County, where the system is administered by the
3	Wisconsin Department of Children and Families (DCF), Division of Milwaukee Child
4	Protective Services (DMCPS); and
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6 7	WHEREAS, DCF provides insufficient funding to counties for the provision of child abuse and neglect services including prevention, investigation, treatment, and out-
8 9	of-home placement costs, though the state has primary responsibility for compliance with federal requirements and shares liability for ensuring the system is meeting its obligations
10	to children and families in all 72 counties; and
11	to emiliaren and rammes in an 72 countres, and
12	WHEREAS, in recent years the state of Wisconsin added numerous mandates and
12	practice expectations which increased county child protective services (CPS) workload
14	and costs; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, the opioid and methamphetamine epidemics have brought
17	Wisconsin's child welfare system to a point of crisis, with increasing concern about the
18	system's ability to meet its obligations to children and families; and
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20	WHEREAS, the capacity for counties to continue to bear the lion's share of
21	financial responsibility to address this crisis has been exhausted, as rising county
22	contributions to the CPS system have far outpaced increases to the DCF Children and
23	Family Aids allocation and counties have used reserve funding to cover CPS expenses
24	and increase staffing; in Barron County in 2013, the State share was \$623,523.16
25	(29.22%), the County share was 1,510,118.00 (70.78%) and in 2017 the State share was
26	640,188.00 (18.98%), the County share was 2,732,722.27 (81.02%); and

28	WHEREAS, maintaining sufficient resources for Wisconsin's child welfare system
29	is critical to secure the safety and future of our most vulnerable children; and
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31	WHEREAS, without a proportional increase in the DCF Children and Family
32	Services allocation, the CPS system has been stressed for over a decade, causing
33	caseloads for CPS workers to grow to unreasonable levels, contributing to high levels of
34	staff turnover in some counties and an overrun of out-of-home care costs above what
35	counties can sustain within available resources, in 2013 Barron County children's out of
36	home care costs were \$948,244 and in 2017 children's out of home care costs were
37	\$1,212,829 an increase of 28%; and
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39	WHEREAS, Wisconsin's CPS system leaves significant gaps in state-level
40	oversight for all counties except Milwaukee County, including the absence of caseload

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standards, no process for regular legislative evaluation and prioritization of CPS needs 41 and the absence of a legislative committee that provides regular policy guidance 42 concerning CPS system issues such as adequate funding, performance, cost sharing and 43 44 long-term stability; and 45 WHEREAS, along with DMCPS, all eleven of Wisconsin's peer states with 46 county-administered CPS systems have either adopted caseload standards for CPS 47 caseworkers, completed thorough workload studies as a basis of determining funding 48 needs, or otherwise have made significant recommendations related to keeping CPS 49 50 workloads manageable; and 51 **WHEREAS**, the children within Wisconsin's CPS system are too important to 52 allow the current level of under resourcing, oversight gaps and, disparity of attention, 53 while shifting the burden to property taxpayers. 54 WHEREAS, this resolution was approved by the Health & Human Services Board 55 on November 26, 2018, on a vote of 9-0 with Bartlett, Fladten, Heil, Knutson, Kolpack, 56 Moen, Muminovic, Pannier and Skoug voting in favor and no members voting against. 57 WHEREAS, this resolution was approved by the Executive Committee on December 58 5, 2018, on a vote of 9 - 0 with Okey, Bartlett, McRoberts, Heinecke, Rindsig, Hanson, 59 Thompson, Buchanan and Horstman voting in favor and no members voting against. 60 61 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Barron County Board of 62 Supervisors does hereby request that the state of Wisconsin increase the Children and 63 Family Aids Allocation to counties in the 2019-21 state biennial budget by \$30 million 64 annually in order to cover a greater share of out-of-home care costs and increase staffing 65 levels based on the caseload standards developed by the Wisconsin County Human 66 Services Association (WCHSA) so Wisconsin's CPS system can meet its obligations; and 67 68 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Wisconsin Counties Association urges 69 the state of Wisconsin to close critical oversight gaps by creating legislative mechanisms 70 to review the CPS resource needs of all counties as part of the biennial budget process 71 and ensure an appropriate committee provide ongoing policy guidance to respond to 72 73 emerging CPS trends and ongoing system needs; and 74 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to Governor 75 Scott Walker, Department of Children and Families Secretary Eloise Anderson, 76 Department of Administration Secretary Ellen Nowak, area legislators, and the 77 78 Wisconsin Counties Association. 79
