TO THE HONORABLE, THE OUTAGAMIE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:

MAJORITY

A Speaker's Task Force on Water Quality was created in February of 2019. The bipartisan and bicameral task force has traveled throughout Wisconsin holding 14 hearings. Members heard from hundreds of citizens, more than 70 organizations, and traveled thousands of miles gathering information to address Wisconsin's water quality challenges. At almost all of the hearings, representatives from each county's conservation department spoke regarding the local water quality challenges that are being faced. The most frequently heard suggestions made at the hearings were to increase state funding for county land and water conservation staff. These staff work directly with farmers to development relationships and assist in a variety of ways including land and water resource management plan implementation, cost-share grant administration, farmland preservation program administration, management plan implementation, cost-share grant administration, farmland preservation program administration, navigating other complex state and federal grant programs, and advising farmer-led producer-led Watershed Groups.

There is pending legislation that increases the amount appropriated by the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) for county conservation staffing under the soil and water resource management program by \$2,960,900 from the general fund in fiscal year 2020-21. The pending legislation provides that, in fiscal year 2020-21, DATCP may not make a grant for county conservation staffing unless the county receiving the grant agrees to maintain the number of its conservation staff at or above the average number of such positions during the two fiscal years preceding August 1, 2020. The pending legislation also provides that county conservation staff funded through this program may promote, and assist people in enrolling in, the conservation reserve enhancement program, which is a joint federal and state program that pays farmers to remove from production land that is environmentally sensitive and that poses a high priority conservation concern and to plant resource conserving plant species on that land.

NOW THEREFORE, the undersigned members of the Agriculture, Extension Education, Zoning and Land Conservation Committee recommend adoption of the following resolution.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Outagamie County Board of Supervisors does support pending legislation that would promote and assist with enrollment in the conservation reserve enhancement program and increase the amount appropriated by the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer

Protection (DATCP) for county conservation staffing under the soil and water resource management program by \$2,960,900 from the general fund in fiscal year 2020-21, and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Outagamie County Board of Supervisors does support pending legislation that would provide, in fiscal year 2020-2021, that the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection may not make a grant to a county for the purpose of funding county land conservation personnel under s. 92.14(3)(a) unless that county enters into an agreement with the department to maintain or increase its number of county land conservation personnel positions at or above the average number of such positions in its two fiscal years preceding August 1, 2020, and BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Outagamie County Clerk be directed to forward a copy of this resolution to the Outagamie County Land Conservation Department Director, the Wisconsin Counties Association, and the Outagamie County Lobbyist for distribution to legislators. SECTION 3. Fiscal changes.
