


1 WHEREAS: Rusk County administers the Child Support Enforcement
 2 Program on behalf of the state, providing services to Rusk County
 3 Residents including paternity establishment, obtaining child support and
 4 health insurance orders for children, and enforcing and modifying those
 5 orders; and
 6 WHEREAS: Our children's well-being, economic security and success
 7 in life are enhanced by parents who provide financial and emotional
 8 support; and
 9 WHEREAS: County child support agencies collected \$935 Million in
 10 child support during 2019 and established 98,405 health insurance orders
 11 for Wisconsin children; and
 12 WHEREAS: Rusk County's Child Support Agency provides services to
 13 children as well as custodial and non-custodial parents that reduce
 14 childhood poverty rates, establish parental rights and promote the
 15 involvement of both parents in the lives of their children; and
 16 WHEREAS: The economic security and social service programs
 17 provided by Rusk County's Child Support Agency are needed by
 18 Wisconsin children and families now more than ever due to the economic
 19 downturn caused by COVID-19; and
 20 WHEREAS: State funding for county child support services has failed to
 21 keep up with county agency costs, which have steadily increased due to
 22 growing caseloads, inflation and new federal regulations; and
 23 WHEREAS: Wisconsin's Child Support Enforcement Program has
 24 fallen from 2nd in the nation for collecting current support to 5th; and
 25 WHEREAS: Wisconsin's decreased performance has led to the state
 26 losing out on an estimated \$70,000 in potential federal incentive
 27 payments between Calendar Year 2019 and 2020; and
 28 WHEREAS: An abrupt federal interpretation change in June 2019
 29 eliminated \$4.2 million in federal birth cost recovery matching funds for
 30 Wisconsin; and
 31 WHEREAS: Wisconsin's strong performance in child support is at risk
 32 without additional state funding. Further drops in performance would
 33 result in additional reductions to federal funding for Wisconsin; and
 34 WHEREAS: Decreased federal funding results in less funding for Rusk
 35 County's child support agency. This could lead to reductions in child
 36 support enforcement staff and services and reduced child support
 37 collections; and
 38 WHEREAS: New state investments in child support are amplified by a
 39 generous federal match. Every \$1 of state GPR invested in the Child
 40 Support Program generates roughly \$2 in federal matching funds; and
 41 WHEREAS: Wisconsin's Child Support Enforcement Program is
 42 incredibly cost-effective, collecting an average of \$6.20 in support for
 43 every dollar invested in the program.
 44 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Rusk County Board**
 45 **of Supervisors respectfully requests that state funding for county**
 46 **child support agencies be increased by \$4 million GPR in each fiscal**
 47 **year of the 2021-23 Wisconsin state budget, which will generate**
 48 **approximately \$7.7 million in additional federal funding each year.**
 49 **This investment will ensure that Wisconsin counties can continue to**
 50 **effectively provide economic support to our children.**


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
