
Workforce shrinking since 2017

- ▶ 7 fell more than 10%










Fewer births today . . . fewer workers in 20 years




Under 18 population . . . shrinking





Not enough young people to replace future retirees











Net migration declining...doesn't fill the long-term gap





Net migration imputed from 2010 and 2020 census populations










National Trends in Net Migration




Wisconsin Net Migration






Net Migration - Age




Net Migration - Income Group













County Level



Income difference improving


