TO THE HONORABLE, THE OUTAGAMIE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:

MAJORITY

1 Treatment Alternative and Diversion (TAD) programs enable non-violent offenders
2 diagnosed with substance use disorder (SUD) to enter evidence based programming. The
3 overall intent of TAD is to reduce recidivism and increase public safety. Additionally,
4 TAD maximizes the use of limited criminal justice resources by establishing a state and
5 local partnership to implement a continuum of community-based services and
6 intermediate sanctions that will increase efficiencies and result in decreased costs
7 associated with the state and county criminal justice systems.

9 There is pending legislation that would extend programs funded by a TAD grant to not
10 only focus on alcohol and other drug treatment, but may provide treatment programs for
11 a person with a mental health diagnosis.
