TO THE HONORABLE, THE OUTAGAMIE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:

MAJORITY

1 On January 25, 2023, the non-partisan Legislative Fiscal Bureau reports the State of
2 Wisconsin has a budgetary surplus estimated at \$7.1 billion, which is the largest budget
3 surplus in Wisconsin's history.

5 Established in 1991, the Local Roads Improvement Program (LRIP) assists local
6 governments in improving seriously deteriorating county highways, town roads, and
7 city and village streets. LRIP is a reimbursement program which pays up to 50% of
8 total eligible costs, with local governments providing the balance.

10 Governor Evers and the Legislature have recently devoted additional funding to
11 counties through General Transportation Aids (GTA) and LRIP, however, counties
12 throughout Wisconsin continue to not receive appropriate financial support to make
13 roads and bridges safe for the speeds and weight of travel experienced throughout the
14 State of Wisconsin.

16 NOW THEREFORE, the undersigned members of the Highway, Recycling and Solid Waste
17 Committee recommend adoption of the following resolution.

18 BE IT RESOLVED, that the Outagamie County Board of Supervisors does respectfully
19 request additional funding through budgetary surplus be allocated to the County General
20 Transportation Aids appropriation as well as for the Local Roads Improvement Program for the
21 backlog of maintenance on the county trunk highway system, and

22 BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Outagamie County Clerk be directed to forward a
23 copy of this resolution to the Wisconsin Counties Association and the Outagamie County Lobbyist
24 for distribution to the State Senators and State Representatives representing Outagamie County and
25 the Governor of the State of Wisconsin.






