# ***RESOLUTION NO.: 15—2023-24***

TO THE HONORABLE, THE OUTAGAMIE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:

***MAJORITY***

1           Outagamie County works in partnership with the State of Wisconsin to provide important  
2           services to our constituents such as roads, public safety, conservation, and human services.  
3           The County has implemented many efforts to improve efficiency, effectiveness, and fees  
4           for services. However, the lack of increase in State funding is seriously impacting the  
5           level of service provided to our constituents and is putting more and more financial burden  
6           on the property tax levy. Many programs have not realized increases despite the effects  
7           of inflation. According to the United States inflation rate, \$100,000 in year 2003 will  
8           need to be increased to \$164,041.30 in year 2023 to maintain purchasing power.

9  
10           This resolution respectfully requests that the State of Wisconsin provide regular revenue  
11           increases for mandated county programs at the rate of inflation. State levy limits will keep  
12           funding gaps from being shifted onto property taxpayers. However, a lack of inflationary  
13           increases in mandated programs will result in programs being cut back, poorly  
14           administered, and longer wait lists. This will continue to increase public cynicism in  
15           government efficiency.

16  
17           The Shared Revenue program operated by the State is one program that is neglected from  
18           year to year. In 1993, the State program shared \$900 million with local governments.  
19           Thirty years later, inflation would bring that amount to \$1.879 billion. Instead, the  
20           program has been cut to \$830 million. According to the Legislative Fiscal Bureau, in  
21           January 2023, Outagamie County only received \$1,517,985 in County and Municipal Aid  
22           or Shared Revenue. With the County having a population of 192,938, this results in a per  
23           capita amount of \$7.87. Citizens of Outagamie County are not being treated fairly. Other  
24           counties received higher per capita amounts of up to \$101.93.

25  
26           In 1993, when the State shared \$900 million with local governments, the State income tax  
27           revenue was \$3.45 billion. In 2021, when the State shared \$830 million, the State income  
28           tax revenue was \$9.28 billion.

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30           Due to State imposed levy limits, quality of programs operated by the County is now in  
31           the sole control of the State government. The County Board urges the State to provide  
32           improved funding in order to maintain programs operated by the County for the benefit of  
33           Wisconsin residents.

35           NOW THEREFORE, the undersigned members of the Legislative/Audit and Human Resources

36           Committee recommends adoption of the following resolution.

1 BE IT RESOLVED, that the Outagamie County Board of Supervisors does hereby respectfully  
2 request that the State of Wisconsin provide regular revenue increases for mandated county programs at  
3 the rate of inflation in order to maintain programs operated by the County for the benefit of Wisconsin  
4 residents, and


5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Outagamie County Board of Supervisors does  
6 respectfully request that the Shared Revenue program be increased in order to provide additional state aid  
7 to local governments, and

8 BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Outagamie County Clerk be directed to forward a copy of  
9 this resolution to the Wisconsin Counties Association and the Outagamie County Lobbyist for distribution  
10 to the State Senators and State Representatives representing Outagamie County and the Governor of the  
11 State of Wisconsin.




