Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter DHS 140

The requirements of local health departments

Local Health Department Levels (Wisconsin Stat. § 251.05)



At each level, a health department must meet level requirements along with the requirements of all preceding levels.

Wisconsin Department of Health Services

Wisconsin Admin. Code ch. DHS 140

- Receives authority from Wisconsin Stat. § 251.20
- Sets three levels of local health departments (LHD)
 - $_{\odot}$ Lists required services of LHDs
 - $_{\odot}$ Sets level I required of all LHDs
 - Provides level II and III additional requirements
- Further describes health officer qualifications in Wisconsin Stat. § 251.06

Required Services All Local Health Departments

- Surveillance and investigation
- Communicable disease control
- Other disease prevention
- Emergency preparedness and response
- Health promotion
- Human health hazard control
- Policy and planning
- Leadership and organizational competencies
- Generalized public health nursing services
- Annual reporting

Additional Required Services Level II Health Departments

- Workforce development
- Quality improvement
- Performance management
- Embedded public health nursing services

Additional Required Services Level III Health Departments

- Community health strategist
- Population health expertise
- Social determinants of health
- Additional performance management and quality improvement
- Public health nursing services embedded

> Wisconsin's Governmental Public Health System Health System

Wisconsin Public Health Authorities

- Local health departments are responsible for public health services in their jurisdictions.
- Local boards of health are the policymaking bodies for local health departments.
- The **Department of Health Services** maintains the public health system.
- **Tribal health centers** are responsible for public health services to tribal members.




Local Health Departments



84 local health departments:

- Are responsible for public health services in their jurisdiction.
- Include several structures: city, city-city, multiple municipality, city-county, county, multi-county, and Tribal.

Evolution of Public Health Practices







Strengthening & Transforming the Public Health System

Healthy populations are more productive, leading to economic stability and growth:

- The governmental Public Health System's Workforce is our greatest asset:
 - Recruit and retain a diverse and qualified public health workforce.
- Create robust organizational capacity, economies of scale, and efficiencies by modernizing our LHDs data systems to address complex community challenges.
- Orient and support board of health members for stronger local health departments.



FPHS Investments Across the Country


Indiana: 2023 Senate Bill 4 ("Health First Indiana"), allocated \$75 million for local public health departments in 2024 followed by \$150 million in 2025. Original ask from the Governor's Public Health Commission requested \$250M annually.



Kentucky: 2020 House Bill 129 set a baseline number of FTEs per 15,000 individuals for local health departments with a cost per FTE of \$109,000. Each LHD must also have enough funds for 1 additional FTE for every 5,000 persons above the initial 15,000 number of residents. The cost must be recalculated every two years during the state hudget cycle

Minnesota: \$15M in 2021 to support local public health infrastructure

FPHS Costing and Capacity Assessment


Funding is needed to fully implement FPHS is based on Wisconsin's existing governmental public health service model.

Previously asked for \$28 million in total for local health departments




LHDs are primarily funded by local tax levy (est. 40-49%) and federal grants (est. 31-34%). Community commitment to public health is evident in the level of funding coming from tax levy. State funds account for less than 5% of local public health funding
